The following CONDITIONS must be met and agreed to prior to issuance of permit:

Code of Ordinance Chapter 254, Article III, Public Vending, Section 254-18 under the heading Exceptions, G. Events on parking lots on private property open to public. If any person desires to possess, distribute or consume alcoholic beverages on parking lots on private property open to the public in the Borough of Chambersburg, said person must apply to the Borough Manager, or his duly authorized representative, for a permit therefor not less than 10 days prior to the date of the scheduled event for which the permit is requested. No fee shall be charged for said permit; however, a permit shall be issued only upon the following conditions:

- (1) Such person must agree, in writing, to assume full responsibility for supervision of the event and the conduct of the group or individuals benefiting from such permit and to properly clean up and restore the premises, after use, to its prior condition.
- (2) Such person must agree, in writing, that adequate precautions shall be taken to ensure that minors or intoxicated persons will not be served or allowed to consume alcoholic beverages at the permitted event.
- (3) No alcoholic beverage shall be distributed or consumed other than on the specific premises described in the permit and only during the time therein stated.
- (4) No permit shall be issued to any person who has failed on a previous occasion to comply with the provisions for the granting of a permit.
- (5) No permit may be issued for a period in excess of six consecutive days, nor may multiple permits be issued for more than a total of six days in any calendar year.
- (6) If there is any charge or donation for admission to the event or purchase of any merchandise, food or drink, then before a permit will be issued the applicant must submit proof that he obtained the permit from the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board.
