CHAMBERSBURG'S PRELIMINARY AQUATIC CENTER DESIGN RELEASED FOR PUBLIC INPUT

Chambersburg – On July 2, the Memorial Park Pool Design Committee has reached the goal of 50% design of the new family aquatic center by July 4, 2016. The Committee has a lot of detail work left to do but it was suggested that the rough layout be shared with Town Council and the public so that constructive comments can be obtained in the process. The design is presented in two (2) very large poster boards at the Memorial Park Pool for viewing or available for download on the Borough's **Transparency Page** at www.chambersburgpa.gov

Chambersburg is a unique community. Chambersburg supplies more services than any other municipality in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. In addition to typical town functions, Chambersburg is Pennsylvania's only municipality supplying electric & gas. Chambersburg is 1 of 35 Boroughs to operate a municipal non-profit electric utility. Chambersburg is the largest municipal electric utility in the State, twice as large as the second largest, Ephrata, Lancaster County; and, the only one to operate generation stations. Chambersburg is 1 of 2 municipalities in PA to operate a natural gas utility. The other is Philadelphia, which does not operate an electric utility. Nationally, Chambersburg is 1 of 2,000 communities to have its own electric system and 1 of 800 communities to have a natural gas system but 1 of only about 50 to operate both. Chambersburg manages a regional water system, a regional sanitary sewer system (not through an independent Authority), and a new storm sewer utility; one of the first storm sewer utilities to form under the new Federal mandate to regulate stormwater. Chambersburg currently has 20,360 residents (2012). www.chambersburgpa.gov
